Part 1

Keeping of Bees

§101. Keeping of Bees Prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, company, association or corporation, to keep or maintain, or cause to be kept or maintained, any bees of any kind, within the limits of this Borough and the keeping or maintaining of any bees within this Borough, whether before or after the passage of this Part, is hereby declared to be a public nuisance, and every violation or infraction of this Part by such person or persons, company, association or corporation, whether it be by omitting, failing or refusing to comply with the provisions of this Part, shall be subject, upon conviction, to the penalties outlined in §102. (Ord. 42, 4/4/1932; as amended by Ord. 153, 2/2/1987)

§102. Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00); and/or to imprisonment for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days. Part 2

Noisy Animals

§201. Intent and Purpose. The Borough Council of the Borough of Halifax, finding that excessive levels of sound are detrimental to the physical, mental and social well-being of the people as well as to their comfort, living conditions, general welfare and safety and being therefor a public health and welfare hazard, hereby declares it to be necessary to provide for the greater control and more effective regulation of excessive sound and the sources of excessive sound within the Borough of Halifax. (Ord. 153, 2/2/1987)

§202. Noise Disturbance. It shall be illegal within the Borough of Halifax for any person or persons to own, possess, harbor, or control any animal or bird which makes any noise continuously and/or incessantly for a period of ten minutes or makes such noise intermittently for one-half hour or more to the disturbance of any person any time of the day or night regardless of whether the animal or bird is physically situated in or upon private property, said noise being a nuisance; provided, that at the time the animal or bird is making such noise no person is trespassing or threatening to trespass upon private property in or upon which the animal or bird is situated nor is there any other legitimate cause which justifiably provoked the animal or bird. §203. Exceptions. This Part shall not be deemed to prohibit or otherwise declare unlawful any agricultural operations protected from the nuisance suits by Act No. 1982-133. (Ord. 153, 2/2/1987)

§204. Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00); and/or to imprisonment for a term not to exceed ninety (90) days. (Ord. 153, 2/2/1987)
